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Chateau Tebeau Winery Tour

On Thursday September 15th a group of 7 chapter members and 9 BGSU students met at Chateau Tebeau Winery near Helena, Ohio to get an introduction to the winery and its products and the winemaking process.



Our tour started out amongst the vines, the first plantings were made 5 years ago, a total of 316 vines with a mix of grape varieties for red and white wines, this followed the next year by a second planting of 1600 vines just a short distance away.

The area has limestone based soil with good drainage and is ideal for vines, for the first 3 years grapes are removed as they appear to allow the vines to put growth into the plant rather than the fruit.



We noticed there were rose bushes planted at the ends of the rows of vines; this is not just to add a touch of color but is because roses and vines are subject to the same diseases and the roses display symptoms about 2 weeks before the vines, giving a window where the correct treatment can be applied.

Once established the vines are tended by hand with unwanted shoots and excess foliage removed in the spring, the goal is to encourage the development of the fruit and allow the sunlight to reach the grapes and ripen them. They had just finished harvesting some of the vines the day before our tour and were planning on a further three days of harvesting starting the next day, a vine will typically produce between 5 and 6 pounds of grapes, all harvested by hand, and it takes roughly 1500 pounds of grapes to produce 100 gallons of wine.

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After harvesting the grapes are brought to the processing area where they first pass through a small machine which destalks the grapes, they then go through a crusher and the juice is pumped to a stainless steel holding tank, the tank is then moved into a large chiller where it is held for 3 days allowing particulates to settle.

After settling the juice is transferred to another tank for fermentation, yeasts can be added at this stage to help fermentation, and different varieties are used to impart certain characteristics to the different types of wine.



After fermentation is complete the wine is aged, typically in stainless steel tanks for white and oak barrels for red, the wood of the barrels imparts certain flavors to the wine dependent on the wood(s) used in construction, these flavors can be further enhanced by placing fresh staves inside the barrel or inserting a holder filled with oak chips.

Once the ageing process is complete the product is bottled, labelled and is ready for sale. Sales today are all within Ohio, some via stores including Perrysburg, Elmore, Sandusky and other local towns; however most sales are made directly from winery where the hospitality room offers the chance to purchase samples and try the finished product before committing to a bottle or a case.

Although Chateau Tebeau winery has approximately 2000 vines under cultivation the winery purchases grape juice from other vineyards in Ohio to increase output and also purchases some strawberry and peach juice to make fruit wines.

Total output last year was about 10,000 gallons up from 2,000 gallons the year before.
